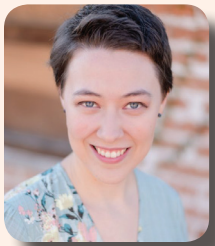

Last week, we defined hope as confidence in God's self-giving love, knowing that because of it we can always receive forgiveness and are constantly invited to life everlasting with him.

Now, there are two things that oppose hope. The first is despair. Those who despair stop hoping for salvation, stop looking for God's help to attain salvation, or stop seeking God's forgiveness for their sins. The other opposing idea to hope is presumption. One can presume they can save themselves without God's help, or one can presume they can receive God's forgiveness without conversion.

Despair and presumption can be strong temptations in our lives, especially in the most difficult of moments. So how can we continue to hope in these times? Well, we can remember three very important things about God. First, God is faithful to his promises. Second, God is faithful to his mercy, which is the form his self-giving love takes when it flows out of itself to its creatures like us. And third, God's love is everlasting.

And as we remember these things about God, we can choose to seek him out in various ways, like conversion, prayer, seeking his help, and accepting his help through the support of your parish community or experiences you have on a particular day. There's a prayer in particular I like to use called the Litany of Trust. I encourage you to look it up this week and pray it earnestly. Brothers and sisters, let us pray to our Father in Heaven that we never lose sight of his love for us, that we never lose sight of hope in him. God Bless,

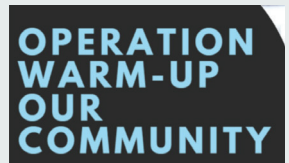
