In this "eat healthier" course I'm taking, a lesson popped up about the days one might slip off their diet. They said the best way to get back on track is to say "Oh, well," and accept that mistake as a fact of life. We're imperfect humans, after all.

Unfortunately for me, by brain was all too eager to follow that advice. After one week of saying "Oh, well" to every fudge bar stocked up in my freezer, I gained several pounds and felt crummy in the tummy. I hated myself for what I was doing, and yet I made no plans of returning to my healthier lifestyle. See, I was too busy offering up excuses: I'm human, I'm not perfect, it's my choice if I indulge.

As disciples of Christ, we are bombarded left and right with temptations. I want to eat as much as I want, I want to use my money to buy things for me, I want to hate rather than forgive, I want, I want, I want. Does it ever pop into our heads that Christ calls us to live differently? Yes, as humans we make mistakes, but we should never use that knowledge as an excuse to sin.

It's not always easy to live a life of Christ. It's far easier to eat more than we need, to spend money only on ourselves, to proudly hold onto our hatred for others, and to follow our own desires. But if we are to call ourselves servants of Christ, then we must first and foremost serve God. If we want to someday rejoice with the angels and saints in heaven, we need to stop making excuses and start taking up our crosses and following Christ. Feed others before yourself; spend money on others first; forgive those who hurt you. Let us give up the excuses that make us feel we're off the hook and instead sincerely ask ourselves who Christ is calling us to be.
