**Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA):** For those considering becoming a Catholic, contact Sheila at the office.


**First Communion:** First Communion/Reconciliation is usually in second grade. Any questions, contact Stacey at the office.

We will begin bringing up the gifts of the Eucharist. Below is some information from an article written by Fr. Thom Mahoney.

"Many times when parishioners are asked to bring up the gifts, they are reluctant, and I am sure there are many reasons. The procession with the bread and wine is symbolic of our own journey from this life to eternal life. The bread and wine are also symbolic of each one of us. Just as the bread and wine are transformed into the Body and Blood of Christ, so are we transformed as members of that Body. When, in addition to the gifts of bread and wine, members of the community offer gifts of money for the work of the Church or donations of food for the poor, this symbolizes our willingness to share what we have been given to be used for the building of God's kingdom."

Our next addition to be added to Mass is Bells at the Consecration. Below is part of an article written by Msgr William J. King.

"Catholic worship excites the senses with movement and color, incense and music – the "smells and bells" of tradition. This is because we bring the entirety of ourselves to prayer: body and soul. Posture marks the solemnity and reverence of certain moments – for instance, standing at the proclamation of the Gospel, kneeling for the consecration. Bells were rung to alert the people to what they could not easily see or hear, so that they could attend to the important and solemn action at the altar. Today, use of the bells is optional, since language, posture and acoustics generally permit the congregation to follow the action of the Mass. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal has this to say about the practice: "A little before the Consecration, if appropriate, a minister rings a small bell as a signal to the faithful. The minister also rings the small bell at each elevation by the Priest, according to local customs (No 150)."
