**Food for Friends Ministry.** What a blessing it is to be part of Church of the Resurrection Parish!

About 40 filled backpacks with school supplies, donated school supplies, food, and personal hygiene products for the Ben Franklin Community Room have been donated by parishioners. The children are going to get off to a great start!

Along with the backpacks that parish members have filled, Running Start also donates to the schools in Rochester, and surrounding communities. We supplemented about 150 more backpacks with supplies to make a complete grade level for those in need. All of these backpacks are needed. If you have the opportunity, thank United Way and Scheels for their support in donating backpacks and supplies for Running Start. This was an awesome and successful project. Thank you to all who participated.

We have received generous donations and have exceeded our \$3,000 budget. However, the plan is to stay within budget. We will be purchasing tennis shoes, winter gear, food, gift cards, laundry soap, personal hygiene items, etc.

**Channel One** is taking a different direction this year for their partnership. Plans have not been officially announced at this time. As information is released, I will pass on to you. Schools will not be receiving their weekly bags of food to send home with the children.

The food shelf at Ben Franklin has been provided for by the generosity of our parish. We plan to continue this much needed ministry. Keep the food simple. Many of the children can make simple meals and use the microwave. Cereals, canned fruits and veggies, pasta, canned marinara sauces, mac and cheese, canned soups, snacks, puddings, tortilla shells, canned tuna and chicken – you get the idea. Food cannot be expired.

**Sewers** – thank you for your efforts in making "ditty bags"! These will be filled with personal hygiene items and be given out throughout the school year. 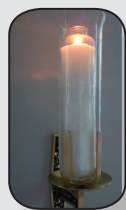

At the Society of St. Vincent de Paul's recent National Assembly in Baltimore, the SVdP National Foundation honored recently retired Bishop John Quinn with its Inaugural Founder's Award. The award recognizes his exceptional service and outstanding contributions to the National Council of the United States, Society of St. Vincent de Paul. Bishop Quinn was enthusiastically chosen as the inaugural recipient of the award, which will be given by the National Foundation annually going forward. "Like the Society's original founders, Frédéric Ozanam and his friends, Bishop Quinn's contributions have had a lasting impact on SVdP, and he has left a legacy of faith and service," said Chief Advancement Officer Ryan Carney.

Bishop Quinn served the Society of St. Vincent de Paul as its National Episcopal Advisor for 12 years, helping to advance the Society and champion its mission to his brother Bishops. A beloved figure within the Society, he also spiritually fed and guided the Society's leaders and Vincentian volunteers during that time. More recently, he has served as Spiritual Advisor to the National Foundation, which works to support the work of the National Council and strengthens the Vincentian network of charity through financial support and other endeavors. Bishop Quinn recently retired as Bishop of Winona-Rochester, but will continue to advise and support the work of the National Foundation. Congratulations, Bishop Quinn! We thank you for your service and devotion to the Society.

I know, I know, I've already encouraged you during Mass to consider ministry. But, as I find this subject incredibly important, allow me to spend a few more words on it.

When I was very young, five or six, I was performing "Somewhere over the Rainbow" everywhere. Let's face it—I was adorable, and I knew it. People cooed over me, and I ate up the attention. Singing for others gave me immense pleasure, for I could control them with it. So when my grandpa showed up one day and asked me to sing it for him, I turned toward him sweetly and replied, "No." Then I ran out to play, knowing that now I was an even hotter commodity. But when I turned around, I saw something that caused my conscience to scream. And no, it wasn't the frustration on my mother's face. It was the sadness on my grandpa's. That day, I kept the gifts God blessed me with for myself, and in turn it created pain in the world.

That day, I vowed to always use my gifts not to find pleasure for myself, but to become a blessing for others so that God's love could shine that much brighter. Years later, when my grandpa was close to the end of his life and lost his joy, I sang for him. Immediately he smiled and shined with more happiness than I had ever seen before. And when I left his hospital room, I saw ten more people in wheelchairs beaming just as brightly as him.

You may not have the gift of music, but you were indeed blessed with gifts from God that make you uniquely you. Do not keep them to yourself, my brothers and sisters in Christ. Use them to make visible Christ's love. I promise you, you'll feel far happier and more peaceful when you use your gifts for others rather than yourself.
