THROUGH MY TIME SERVING GOD

through the Catholic Church, I've come to realize something when teaching or talking about the gift of life: there are many aspects of it that we don't personally experience or talk about much, so we don't take the time we should to understand it fully. Since most of us don't experience the death of a loved one until we're much older, for instance, most of us don't think about the end of life, much less talk about it, for years. On the opposite end of the spectrum, how many of us think about new life when it isn't something we are anxiously awaiting in our future?

I can honestly say that while I've always believed in God's word that life is sacred and deserving of rights in all its stages, including conception, I never fully understood the gravity of that truth until one night with my Catholic young adult group in Arizona. To prepare ourselves to join the city wide pro-life march, we all got together the night before to watch "Unplanned," the movie based on the true life story of Abby Johnson, a woman who once served as a director of a Planned Parenthood clinic. While I had known the gist of what I was about to see, I was completely taken away. It's one thing to know what an abortion is, and yet a whole other thing to experience. Those 109 minutes became a pivotal moment in my life. Before that night, abortion was merely something I knew to be wrong. But after that movie, abortion became real to me.

That same Abby Johnson reflected upon this as well. During a convention a few years ago, she said, "For me, abortion is real. I know what it sounds like, I know what abortion smells like. Did you even know that abortion has a smell?"
