Food For Friends Ministry and Operation One More will be delivering food as a gift to the Franklin families the week before Christmas.

It is our hope that we are able to bring a bit of joy during the often financially stressful, holiday season. Please consider donating non-perishable items to the collection bins located in the gathering space.

Kara Merrill, Franklin's Community School Facilitator, works with the staff, students, and families. In her words: "Together we collaborate with students, families, and the school community to foster partnerships and support learning through providing resources and opportunities for all." Excerpt from our Gifts of Mercy Advent Daily Reflections:

I remember the first time I got really sick after I moved out of my family home. It was the flu, and a terrible flu at that. To make matters worse, I couldn't skip any of my college classes and I had a performance later that week. I didn't know what to do. I had an incredibly high fever, with no voice whatsoever, and I could barely think. I felt so bad I took my very first dose of cold medication. But even that didn't work! Desperate, I called my parents, not knowing what else to do.

A few minutes later, my mother picked me up and drove me home. She and my dad spent the rest of the day caring for me and whispering words of comfort. They tucked me into my childhood bedroom and helped me get ready for school the next day. I still felt terrible that morning, but the love given to me by my parents helped me face all the challenges of that day.

The last thing most of us want to do is visit the sick, but doing so can make such an incredible difference in their life. Just like our parents help us get better, let us be there for those we see sick or injured and do what we can to help them find the strength to face the challenges of the day. Lord, source of all that is good, please watch over those who are in need of your help. May they find healing through your merciful love and the goodness of others.


