# Weekly Words from The Rock

'Tis the Season

During this time of the year we often hear it said, "Tis the Season." "Tis the Season" is about the seasons of Advent and Christmas. In the Catechist magazine of November/December 2016, we find a quiz around these two seasons. Last week, I provided eight questions from the quiz and the answers I provide the week.

Question 1: Fill in the blank. "O Come, O come Emmanuel and ransom captive \_\_\_\_\_.

- A. Israel
- B. Nazareth
- C. Bethlehem
- D. Jerusalem

Answer: A. Israel

Question 2: True or False. When the Virgin Mary announced she was pregnant, everyone was happy. Answer: False. Mary had a hard time explaining to Joseph that she had been visited by an angel of God and was pregnant with God's son (see Matthew 1:18-25).

Question 3: Mary was the mother of \_\_\_\_\_

- a. John the Baptist
- B. God but not Jesus
- C. God
- d. Jesus but not God

Answer: C. God. Since Jesus, her human son, was God, Mary was the mother of God. As we say in the Hail Mary: "Holy Mary, Mother of God."

Question 4: True or False. Mary was a teenager when the angel told her she would be the mother of God's son.

Answer: True

Question 5: When did/will the kingdom of God begin?

- a. when Jesus returns
- b. when Mary conceived Jesus in her womb
- c. when people stop sinning
- d. with Jesus' death and resurrection

Answer: B. when Mary conceived Jesus in her womb. Throughout Jesus' life, his miracles and teachings were signs that the kingdom of God had already started as soon as his birth was announced to Mary (see Mark 1:15).

Question 6: True of False. It was snowing when Jesus was born on the first Christmas in Bethlehem.

Answer: False. Bethlehem is in Israel, which is part of the Middle East where snow is uncommon – except on mountains.

Question 7: True or False. St. Francis of Assisi, who is credited with being among the first to use a crèche scene to remember the Christmas story, was present at the birth of Jesus Christ.

Answer: False. Francis is credited with being among the first to use a crèche with animals and a baby to remember the Christmas story, but he lived almost 1,200 years after Jesus was born.

Question 8: True or False. The readings at Mass for the first weeks of Advent focus on Jesus' second coming and the judgment of the world.

Answer: True. Catholics are called to examine their lives, repent, and turn to God, who will judge between the just and the unjust.

## The Philippine-American Association of


Rochester will have a Christmas Novena Mass on Friday, December 16th at the Co-Cathedral at St. John the Evangelist. Filipinos call the novena mass Simbang Gabi. It is a Christmas tradition in the Philippines where families would go to Church every morning or evening 9 days before Christmas in preparation for the celebration of the birth of Jesus. Family members would offer up special prayers requesting blessings from the Lord. Here in Rochester, we will celebrate the Advent Season in one evening Mass.

Bishop Barron will preside over the Mass. The Mass is open to all, not just Filipinos. The Mass starts at 7 pm but there is a prelude that begins at about 6:40 that includes a display of live Nativity Scene. Shortly after the Mass, a reception will be held at the St. John's school gym. All are invited to reception.

News from Stacey, Grades 1-5, Family Ministry, dre1to5fm@rescathroch.org Third Week of Advent: Today is the day we light the pink candle on our Advent wreath and the priest wears the rose colored vestments. It is Gaudete Sunday and the readings reflect the JOY we anticipate in the arrival of Baby Jesus. The first reading tells us to "rejoice with joyful song." The second reading emphasizes that we must be patient in our waiting. We invite each member of our parish family to pause each day this week to share something that brought them joy and to thank God for it as we patiently wait for the coming of the Lord.





A Day to Honor Mary this week: Monday, December 12th is the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Our Lady of Guadalupe first introduced herself as the Mother of God and the mother of all humanity when she appeared on the hill of Tepeyac in Mexico in 1531. An indigenous peasant, Juan Diego, saw a glowing figure on the hill. After she had identified herself to him, Our Lady asked that Juan build her a shrine in that same spot, in order for her to show and share her love and compassion with all those who believe. Over 20 million people visit the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe each year, now situated on the very same hill on which she appeared. In 1990, Pope St. John Paul II visited Mexico and beatified Juan Diego. In 2000, he was declared a

saint. We have a shrine to Our Lady of Guadalupe in LaCrosse, WI. It is a wonderful place to learn about Our Lady and other saints. Our Lady of Guadalupe, pray for us! Amen.
