Weekly Words from The Rock

Christmas

Merry Christmas! I hope this Christmas finds you full of joy and peace. I hope this Christmas doesn't find your stocking filled with coal!!

There is much mystery and majesty surrounding Christmas. God coming to us as man. God seeing the devastation of sin and sending his Son to save us. Jesus being born in a stable outside of Bethlehem. The angels rejoicing. The shepherds and wise men laying eyes upon the Christ-child and sharing with anyone willing to listen what they saw and heard. In this year's Christmas column, let us take each letter to the word Christmas and see what can be learned.

C = Christ. We hear in the Christmas story the name given to the child. Jesus meaning God saves and Emmanuel meaning God is with us. Another name given to Jesus is "Christ". Christ means "Anointed One." Jesus was anointed to bring Good News to the world. Jesus came to preach and teach a word of life and hope. The "Christ" was sent to save people from their sins.

H = Here. We have the honor of celebrating the Christmas story here and now. The Christmas story isn't something left to the past; we gather to bring the Christmas story into the life of our world today. The message and hope of Jesus Christ is alive and will be until he comes with all the angels in glory.

R = Remember. We celebrate special days to remember. Birthdays are a good example. We wish someone a happy birthday to remember their birth. The same is true of Christmas. We celebrate Christmas to remember. Think for a moment if Christmas wasn't celebrated throughout the world for 100 years. What would happen? It would lose its significance and meaning. Coming together keeps the story alive.

I = I. You have heard it said, "There is no I in God" and that is true. The story of Jesus Christ is the story of someone expending himself always and everywhere for the sake of another. While Jesus was never about

himself, his concern was with each individual "I," each person.

S = Salvation. Why did God send his son? It is all about salvation. With the sin of Adam and Eve, the gates of heaven were closed. To be reopened someone had to conquer sin and death and that person was Jesus Christ. There is no salvation outside of Jesus Christ.

T = Together. We live in a very divided time. Politically, we are divided. Conversing, we tend to yell at and over the other. Unlike Jesus, many times we live for the "I". For Christians who claim a belief in Jesus, we have to be about unity. Let us never forget that in his farewell discourse Jesus prayed, "I pray not only for them, but also for those who believe in me through their word, so that they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you, that they also may be in us, that the world may believe that you sent me" (John 17:20-21).

M = Manger. It is still difficult for me to fathom. God comes and we tell him, "There is no room for you here." God is laid in a manger. I am not certain that has ever happened to another human being yet we did it to God. Still, around that manger, we don't see a room filled with anger, resentment or regret. It is a room filled with joy, wonderment and love.

A = Always. Always remember what Christmas means to your life. God came for you and He wants you to be with him. Cultivate that relationship.

S = Special and Spectacular. What else can be said of Christmas. There is only one day of the year we call Christmas and the story is beyond the breath and beauty of anything imagined.


