We will receive your request; approve it and you will get an email stating you can now access My Own Church. It may take a day or two. If you do not get an email, call the office 507 288 5528.
- 3. If you do not have access to a computer, call the office to request a printed copy, we can mail it to you or stop in the office to pick it up.

We donated over 230 pairs of socks to shelters all around Rochester during our Gifts of Mercy Community Event, along with homemade hats and gloves. St. Vincent de Paul and Food for Friends received almost 100 cans of soup and stew to give to the hungry. Cronin House received over 65 gift cards to purchase basic necessities for the homeless.

Fifty ornaments were passed out to the sick and homebound. Hundreds of prayers were said for the living and the dead. All of us present learned to care for our public spaces and to forgive others and ourselves. We discovered that a great deal of water is needed for various luxuries and that there are little ways we can teach others about Christ in our daily lives.

We also received this from the Rochester FMC Inmates after writing Christmas cards to them: Greetings! Would you please be so kind as to convey gratitude, appreciation, and blessings to the group(s) that provided at the Eve Mass all those Christmas cards and messages to us inmates.

I am so glad our parish was able to delve deeper into the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy. And yet...it's not over yet. We now have a new mission. We must teach what we have learned to others, even here at Resurrection. We must shine light upon the Works of Mercy through our commitment to them. What's more, we must ask ourselves constantly what else we can do to offer love to others. In essence, we must embrace our calling to be disciples of Christ.

Remember St. Teresa of Avila's words: "Christ has no body now on earth but yours, no hands but yours, no feet but yours. Yours are the eyes through which he looks Compassion on this world." Let us therefore choose to become the new body of Christ and spread his love to the world.
