

Do you ever find it difficult to profess and live God's word? I certainly do. In fact, one of the reasons I am often writing these bulletin articles at two in the morning is because I analyze every single word I write, worried I will hurt or offend someone.

As a Catholic performer, I grew up terrified to talk to others because, unfortunately, there is still a lot of pain between the performing arts and the Catholic Church. Mainly, it stems from both sides feeling unsupported and unaccepted by the other. For years, I never spoke a word about my faith so that performers would feel comfortable enough to sing with me. Similarly, you'll find that I will rarely offer up any of my stories as a performer because sharing them has caused Catholics to judge and shun me. My solution, then, was to never offer any of God's teachings with anyone.

You might not be a performer, but I have a feeling you've had similar experiences. And, if you're anything like me, it might even cause you to waver in your desire to follow God's law constantly by considering or supporting ideas that go against that law. Take, for instance, the dignity of every human life. We know from God himself that all life is precious and cherished by him, and that it is our responsibility to protect it, from conception to natural death. It might be easier to avoid talking about abortion issues. It might be even easier to support abortion laws. If we do that, though, we are denying our complete hope and trust in Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. How can we grow as Christ's disciples when we walk away whenever things get difficult or when we find options that better serve our earthly self-interests? And if we refuse to be the voice for unborn children, how will they be heard?

Today, I write to you unafraid to profess my trust in God and in the laws of his kingdom, and I encourage you to do the same. Compassionately teach God's commandments to all people. Do your part to love and care for all life. (see next column)
