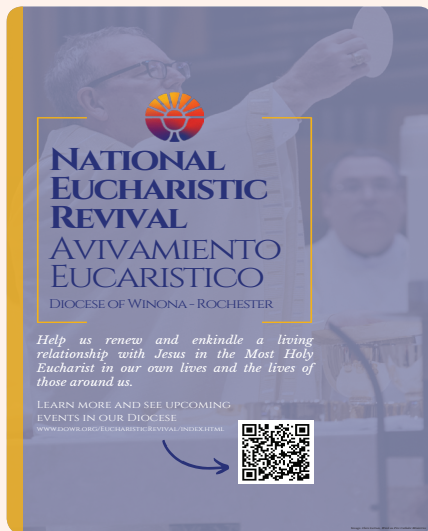

We pursue this mission in mandating that all diocesan parishes, schools, religious education classes and other programs/ministries complete the following: thoroughly screening and supervising all employees and volunteers who work with children and young people as part of their ministry; by providing appropriate training in recognizing and reporting child abuse to appropriate civil and Church authorities; by holding all members of the clergy, employees and volunteers who work with children and young people to Christ-centered and professional codes of conduct.

**Virtus training is required before parishioners 18 years and older can volunteer, join a Resurrection ministry or serve our parish.** This training is online. Lately we've been receiving lots of donations in the chapel, including flowers and altar linens. And I want to thank you all so much for your donations. Not only do these offerings enhance our space of worship, they also are an incredible reminder that all of us, along with our daily offerings, become one body, one spirit in Christ.

While I want to continue to encourage and support your generous donations, I would also like to pass on some guidelines regarding these donations. Since there are so many parishioners running various ministries and projects at Resurrection, we're finding that some of these donations are causing confusion and misunderstandings between them. In order to support everyone, therefore, please follow these two simple guidelines when donating items:

1. You are welcome to bring in vases of cut flowers to the chapel, where our Art Environment team will water them and remove them when the flowers wilt. Avoid pollen-heavy flowers, especially lilies, as many adorers are allergic to them.
  2. If you would like to donate any other items, please first ask the parish office.
- If you're looking for other ways to donate, check out these ideas:

- Ask the parish office if there's something they're currently raising money for.
- Consider offering up an hour in the adoration chapel praying for the needs of the parish and of the world.
- You can also offer up your time by asking the parish office if we need help with a project or a ministry during the week.
- You can even offer up your talents by joining one of Resurrection's many ministries. We are always in need of more ministers, especially liturgical ministers that serve Christ during Mass.

Once again, thank you so much for offering yourselves to Christ! Please know how grateful we are to each and every one of you.
